If the employee has completed the 24 & 40-Hour HAZWOPER Training, would this satisfy the 10 Hour OSHA requirement?	<p>No, the only acceptable training are the 10 Hour or 30 Hour OSHA Outreach Training Programs. What type of training cannot be counted toward outreach training time?</p> <p>A. Training that is conducted to comply with requirements in the OSHA standards cannot be counted toward outreach training. Also, CPR and First Aid training cannot be counted towards fulfillment of outreach requirements because they are not considered occupational safety and health topics dealing with hazard recognition or prevention.</p>

1	<p>(a) If a contractor is not in compliance with 1 of the 14 Standards can they bid the job?</p> <p>(b) If any comments are printed on the form will their bid be irregular?</p>	<p>(a) The job can be bid regardless of compliance with the 14 Standards, however, if any of the Standards are not met, the bidder cannot be awarded the contract.</p> <p>(b) The bid would be considered irregular according to the DelDOT Standard Specifications Subsection 102.07B, Irregular Proposals, which states; <i>There are unauthorized additions, interlineations, conditional bids, or irregularities of any kind that may tend to make the proposal incomplete, indefinite, or ambiguous.</i></p>
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
